The International Membership Committee has initiated a new group on the DKG Network called <u>Members in Action</u>. You are invited to join this group to share your chapter success story or a concern regarding chapter membership. This is a great way to share membership information and ideas with others who are membership chairs too. It's easy to join!

Go to www.dkgnetwork.org. Your login is the email address on your DKG profile. The password is delta01. You will need to agree to the terms. Then you will be able to change your password for future use. Once you are on the network, click the Groups tab at the top of the page. Select All Groups and look for Members in Action. Next go to that page and request an invitation from the moderator. Soon you will be able to respond to discussions and post questions of your own. Hope to talk to you there!
